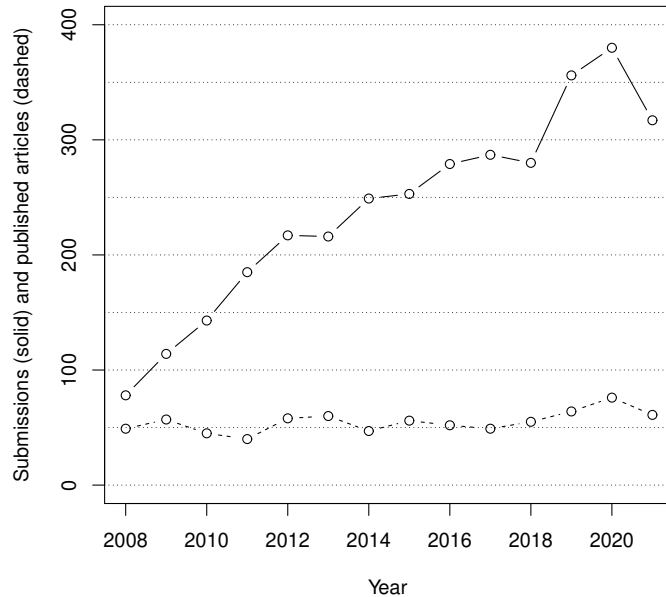

### **Data about the journal**

The following plot shows the continuing trends: more submissions but also a clearer increase in the number of published articles. 69% of the rejections took 1 or 2 days.



For what it is worth, articles from *Judgment and Decision Making* continue to be cited at about the same rate as those from the most similar journal, *Journal of Behavioral Decision Making*. The impact factor (Web of Science) of *Judgment and Decision Making* for 2021 was 2.543, which is about the same as that for the *Journal of Behavioral Decision Making* (2.438). I am unable to find Google Scholar metrics for both journals.
